You can purchase shells at Nemacolin or bring your own but bring plenty. You need a minimum of 100 and I recommend 125. If you have a question about shells call Rich at 412-217-5897. If you do not have a suitable shotgun they have rentals for \$15.00. The cost for our outing is \$64.50 for 100 targets including guide service, eye & ear protection, taxes and gratuities. 

A discounted rate of \$230 for Lodge Hotel rooms and \$299 for Links Townhouse or Chateau Lafayette rooms are also available to MLBC members.


There is also a 15% discount available on golf apparel at the pro shop for MLBC members.
